Shaker Oval Boxes

The Lost Trades Fair was held at Kyneton last March and it was surprising how many "Lost Trades" still exist through many enthusiasts. Rundell & Rundell is one of these enthusiasts and out of their Central Highlands Workshops in Kyneton run workshops on sharing their skills with making Fanback Chair & Rocking Chairs, Bar & Perch Stools, Coopered Buckets, Shaker Oval Boxes, Spoon Carving, Silversmithing, French Polishing, Long Bow Making & Leatherwork.



Last year John Wood Bradley paid his \$250 & went for the weekend to learn how to make Shaker Oval Boxes. The Shakers, besides being a religious group that is an off shoot to the Quakers, are also known for their unique style of furniture. These boxes were made for storing food commodities like flour & sugar as well as small items they did not want lost.

Over two half days you learn the traditional art of oval box making, shaping and steam bending timber, shaping bases and lids and

carefully fitting the boxes together in the traditional methods used by the Shaker communities since the 1700's.

The timbers used are American Maple & Cherry while the walls of the boxes are fastened with minute copper tacks & tooth picks. The walls are appox 2mm thick and the timber is bent by steaming or soaking it in warm to hot water.

Since completing the course John has continued to make these boxes at WOSP with the assistance of Rob Oram, whose skills seem unlimited.

Shaker Oval Box Courses are available in August & October.

 The CWC newsletter has advertised that Liam O'Neill is an Irish professional turner of over 30 years and in 2017 is planning to tour Australia conducting 1 & 2 day training programs utilising various timbers & techniques. The cost is \$850 per day for a club. Program as follows:

Day 1.

Project no 1. Functional bowl using the "Irish grind" technique.

Project no 2. Crooked grain container. Includes:

How to perfect a curve on the inside of a box lid Make the grain appear to match from lid.

Project no 3. Deep bowl with wide rim.

Project no 4. (Optional) Electric chainsaw as turning tool

Day 2.

Project no 5. Platter.

Project no 6. Natural edge bowl.

Project no 7. Hollow vessel.

You can google Liam O'Neill to find out more about him and see his work. If you are interested in attending a training day it should be possible to do so through the Peninsula Woodturners Guild.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY FEBRUARY 2016

I apologise for providing the February report in April/May however because it is in English I thought you might find it informative.

The club finances are in a very good position. During the summer we have used available funds for equipment purchase and repairs and maintenance. The expenditures are directed towards member safety, comfort and improving equipment and facilities.

The revenue this financial year is \$15,801 which is substantially made up of Donations \$3,348, Attendance \$2,875 & Bunnings BBQ. \$7,114

Over the same period the expenditure is \$17,295 with the main expense areas being Equipment Purchases \$5,096, Building Maintenance \$2,139, Repairs to Equipment \$434, Electrical Repairs \$232 & Electricity \$1,884.

This leaves the club with a deficit of \$1,440. Nevertheless Total Funds available are \$19,969 consisting of Current Account \$2,100, Cash at Call \$7,462 & Term Deposit of \$10,401

Since February the club has purchased a 3 phase drum sander and is in the process of having 3 phase connected to the workshop. The club is fortunate that the Rye Lions Club have donated \$1,000 to assist with the 3 phase connection.
