A lot of activity went into the planning / preparation for the club relocation to new location is Vern Wright Reserve, 2-4 Shearwater Place Rosebud West

Some feedback on the workshop:

- Building size 19m x 18m
- The site was previously a tip so the building will be built on 8 concrete pins
- Wiring to all machines
- Disabled toilet
- Disabled Parking
- Gravel road to building
- No Telephone
- Site is on a flood plain & the floor will be raised 600mm

- Mezzanine & various storage areas
- Dust extractor. Will build a wall around it if noise is a problem.
- Spray booth with fan in roof
- Hot water to showers & kitchen
- Fan in building to circulate air
- WOSP is putting in a proposal to Bunnings for a kitchen
- Wireless security System
- Site is a previous dump so 36 pylons required to stabalise the floor

Significant purchases were made to update the machinery for members.

- Carbatec pro Deluxe Router Table Kit with MDY Top. The kit includes the Carbatec "Lift N Lock" Universal Router Lift to make changing the bits easier. Included is a 63mm dust port for efficient extraction from above the table, Micro adjusters and a flip stop.
- The 3 Nova Saturn DVR lathes are state of the art lathes in that they have balance sensors to stop the lathe should the timber be off balance, electronic speed adjustment and many other improvements over what was previously available.
 - 2 additional cast iron stands were also purchased and assist in providing a stable base for the lathes.
