This involved building shelves in the container and moving the timber from the storage shed to the container.

 After many years of providing the leadership of the toys administration John Parrent has resigned from the role. However John will assist the team to make toys in 2019.



Drum Sander Tips

Members should consider putting their projects through the thicknesser prior to sanding.

- 1. Scrape off all dried glue before sanding. Glue lines scorch sandpaper.
- 2. Sand only the high spots on the first pass.
- 3. Angle your boards 10^0 or so. The fibres are cut more cleanly & the glue lines are spread over a wider portion of the belt. Don't feed the wood straight on until the last pass.
- 4. Rotate the crank 1/8th of a turn at the most. Deeper cuts heat up the belt causing it to wear out faster.





Circle Centre

Use a framing square to find the centre of a circle by placing the corner of the square on the circle and marking where the legs of the square meet the circumference. Draw a line from one mark to the other. Do this a second time. These lines intersect at the centre.







Make your marks on painter's tape

Instead of writing directly on a project's parts, stick a piece of painter's tape on each part and put identifying marks on the tape. Then there is no need to sand off your pencil marks during assembly.

Dendrophile

Trompe l'oeil in French means 'deceive the eye', or in terms of art, a super-realistic 3D rendering of a scene or object often achieved in only two dimensions. It's an art form that both delights and challenges the viewer, as is the case with the quirky wood art by UK woodworker Phil Young.

Shown here are Phil Young's sculpted 3D impressions that portray wood in a differently dynamic way. Phil Young uses other materials besides wood to question, in his own words 'everything from their place in contemporary culture through to the very tactility of their nature'.
