New Lathes

The 3 Nova Saturn DVR lathes are state of the art lathes in that they have balance sensors to stop the lathe should the timber be off balance, electronic speed adjustment and many other improvements over what was previously available.

2 additional cast iron stands were also purchased and assist in providing a stable base for the lathes.

Initially you will be unfamiliar with the lathes so take your time to understand their features before getting too serious. Ask your sesion leader if you are uncertain.

Swimming Pool / Workshop Status

Last week John Bayliss & Greg Millar met with some council representatives to discuss the moving of the workshop.

In brief the council would like WOSP to be in its new premises by December 2018.

By then the council will have built our new premises with a complete dust extraction system. However the workshop internals will have to be arranged by the members. So there will be working bees at the new premises leading up to the move.
