Currently the start of the construction of the carpark is being undertaken. Entrance to the club must be from Boneo Road as our access through the council carpark has been cut off.

As of midday Friday half of the trees have been felled. By Monday all the trees will be down. The council were unable to sell the trees so the branches are being mulched and the tree trunks will be cleaned up & sent to China. From there they will be cut up and brought back to Australia as boards.

Start of the new workshop will be mid to late October. From the WOSP viewpoint the club move is still anticipated to be around March / April 2019. Access will not be allowed until there is a "Certificate of Occupancy". Then equipment will have to be transferred and connected to the power & the ducting system. It will be like moving into a new house and where all the associated teething pains will be managed.

WORK on the long-awaited Rosebud Aquatic Centre starts next month with the promise that locals can make a splash at the facility in 2020.

The Mornington Peninsula Shire Council recently awarded a tender for the centre's car park, including footpaths, pram ramps, landscaping and other works, to start in October and finish in March 2019.

The \$41.57 million centre on Besgrove St will be built over three years and will open in late 2020. The centre will include a 50m indoor; learn to swim and warm water program pools, gymnasium, wellness centre, cafe, access ramps and family change rooms.

New Equipment



The router is a well utilised by the toy group. If it is not working progressed is slowed right down. So after an investigation comparing what is required as to what is available the committee has agreed to purchase

Carbatec pro Deluxe Router Table Kit with MDY Top. The kit includes the Carbatec "Lift N Lock" Universal Router Lift to make changing the bits easier. Included is a 63mm dust port for efficient extraction from above the table, Micro adjusters and a flipstop.



The top and front feature T slots which allow the fitting of other jigs and accessories including the included transparent guard. The fence assembly also includes adjustable side scales for setting fence alignment and handy planing spacer bars for accurate edge trimming.

Carbatec Dust Cabinet for Pro Tables. To assist in minimising dust in the workshop, this Cabinet encloses the router removing dust, and allowing efficient air flow to keep the router from overheating. Connected directly to our 100mm (4") network with the integral 4" connection, the cabinet also has a 63mm collection port and hose, to connect to the router tables fence.
