Next Bunnings BBQ – Saturday 25th February 2023

Call for volunteers – the roster is on the notice board in the workshop reception area. We have been allocated this day at short notice thus the call for volunteers is somewhat urgent.

Following that, we have been allocated Sunday 16th April 2023. Please pencil in this date at this stage. The roster sheet is yet to be organized – more details as they come to hand.

Items of Note from the Committee Meeting

- 1. It is planned to purchase:
 - Makita 305mm mitre saw with 2 blades to suit \$1,350
 - 3 Ryobi 18v battery powered drills & 2 18v batteries 4A with discount \$688.75

This will be paid for out of the money being made at Bunnings BBQ's.

- 2. The club will have a table at the Rye Community Market on 4th Feb 2023 with the aim of promoting the club shop.
- 3. The committee is planning to have an Open Day on 25th March 2023 with the aim of attracting the new members & promoting the shop.
- 4. Members are reminded that the workshop has both internal & external security cameras. Consequently, members are discouraged from removing any items from the club that does not belong to them.

New Equipment (from Colin Dobson)

The committee is looking to provide sharp & accurate equipment that is safe.

Consequently, it has introduced a Purchasing Form that requires a description of any new equipment with an appropriate justification of purchase with costing & installation impacts.

Included is a section for the signatures of the proposer, seconder & the president. Then it goes to the committee for final approval.

At the last meeting this process was followed and the committee approved the following:

- Makita 305mm mitre saw with 2 blades to suit.
 - After many years of service, the current miter saw is not as accurate as many members require.
- 3 Ryobi 18v battery powered drills & 2 18v batteries 4A.
 - Although there are lots of drills on the market the club will be standardizing on Ryobi. There are a large number of attachments for the Ryobi battery which can make any

project easier. As Bunnings often donate equipment to the club, we can be in the position to suggest appropriate items that work with the Ryobi battery.

Equipment Maintenance (from Colin Dobson)

WoSP has a Maintenance Book. If a lathe does not work or a saw blade needs sharpening, the session leader (SL) should write up the requirement in the maintenance book. More often than not the session leader will be advised by the members. So, if a member sees a need, discuss it at coffee time to get the view of a few more members and then get the SL to update the Maintenance book. Items noted in the Maintenance Book will be checked and, if possible actioned, the next Monday morning maintenance session.

Something different - USA chairmaker David Douyard to teach workshops in Red Hill.

David Douyard is an award-winning chairmaker who specialises in building Windsor and ladder-back chairs, and also teaches chairmaking in his workshop in Northwest Connecticut, USA. He has been building chairs for more than 20 years having studied under some of the great Windsor and ladderback makers.

In March 2023, to coincide with the Bendigo Lost Trades Fair, David will travel to Australia, and along with Nick Found, teach two classes at Nick's workshop in Red Hill on the Mornington Peninsula, Victoria.

Nick Found is an industrial designer (and goat farmer) who amongst design work and university lecturing has spent the last seven years studying Windsor chairmaking both locally and in America. This year marks a transition as he plans to develop his personal chairmaking practice with a strong focus on moving toward teaching in the following years.

In one class students will make a Jennie Alexander style ladderback chair, while the other will focus on making a Jennie Alexander style rocker. The five students in each class will walk away having learnt to make a chair from a tree as well as weave a seat too. Nearby accommodation is also available.

The chair class runs from March 1–5, and the rocker class from March 22–27.
